THE EAGLE WILL SCREAM.

July the 4th Will be a Gala Day Here.

Plans for the celebration at the fair grounds near this city, are well under way and the various committees are arranging a fine program of sports, games, music and refreshments, aside from the usual oration which will be delivered by one of the best speakers in the state.

The famous historical letter of John Adams, second president of the United States, written to his wife on July 3rd 1776, is appropriate at this time.

"Yesterday the greatest question was decided which ever was debated in America, and a greater perhaps never will be debated among men. A resolution was passed without one dissenting colony, that these United Colonies are, and of right ought to be, free and independent states, and as such they have, and of right ought to have full power to make war, conclude peace, establish commerce, and do all other acts and things which other states make and rightfully do."

"You will see in a few days a declaration setting forth the causes which have impelled us to this mighty revolution, and the reasons which will justify it to God and man."

"When I run through the whole period from 1761 to this, I am surprised at the suddenness as well as the greatness of this revolution. Britain has been filled with folly, and America with wisdom, at least this is my judgment. Time must determine. It is the will of Heaven that the two countries should be sundered forever."

"It may be the will of Heaven that America shall suffer calamities still more wasting and distressing yet more dreadful."

"The second day of July, 1776 will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated

by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty."

"I am well aware of the toil and blood and treasure which it will cost us to maintain this resolution and defend these states. Yet through all the gloom I can see the rays of ravishing light and glory. I can see that the end is worth more than all the means, and that posterity will triumph in that days transaction, even though we should rue it, which I trust in God we shall not."

CHICKEN WITH FOUR LEGS.
