A DEGRADED CRIME

Man From Long Beach, Cal., Arrested by Local Officers.

S. L. Tucker, who has been going under the name of John Knapp, was arrested by Chief of Police Huffman and Sheriff Fenton last evening about eight o'clock at the farm of Robert Boggs, near Greens. Tucker is wanted at Long Beach, Cal., for a crime committed against his own daughter, which, it is stated, was most heinous. Mr. Huffman received a telegram from the authorities at Long Beach asking him to keep an eye out for Tucker and giving a full description of the culprit. It was not long before Chief Huffman had his man located and with Sheriff Fenton made the arrest and brought Tucker to the city and placed him in the county jail. The prisoner practically admits his guilt and will be held awaiting the authorities from Long Beach. He is a man of about fifty years of age and has been in this vicinity for the past three weeks.

BALLINGER TO RETIRE

Reported Los Angeles Man Will Succeed Him.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., June 20.—That United State Senator Frank P. Flint is slated for Secretary Ballinger's position in President Taft's Cabinet was the startling report that reached Los Angeles today, from Washington. It is understood that Mr. Ballinger will retire as soon as he is exonerated by the congressional committee investigating the Interior Department, and that will be within a month.

The news that Flint had been selected came through authoritative channels today to republican leaders, and within an hour the candidacy of E. A. Meserve for the senatorship had been launched.

LAND OFFICE OFFICIALS

Pennsylvania Men Will Serve in Oregon.

WASHINGTON, June 20.—President Taft today nominated and the senate tonight confirmed Bruce R. Kester, of Pennsylvania, as register and Henry G. Guild, of Newport, Or., as receiver at the new Land Office to be opened at Vale, July 1.

After examining the records of both men, the president was satisfied as to their qualifications, and as Secretary Ballinger was anxious to have the office opened July 1, it was decided to name Bourne's candidates. Land Offices are conceded to be senatorial patronage and while consideration was given the protests of Representative Ellis against the appointment of men not residing in the Vale district, the protest was set aside in order that the contest might be terminated and the office opened without further delay.
