VINSON A CANDIDATE.

Says He Will Be in the Race for Sheriff.

Interviewed by a News representative relative to a report to the effect that he had consented to become a candidate for sheriff at the coming general election, W. R. Vinson, of Coles Valley, said that the rumor was true, and added that the encouragement he was receiving at the hands of the voters surpassed all expectations. "I am receiving expressions of encouragement from all sections of the county," said Mr. Vinson, "and the class of citizens extending me that encouragement only make me feel more like entering the race. The encouragement was unsolicited and came as a great surprise, both to me and my friends." When asked as to what he attributed his chief strength, Mr. Vinson hesitated for a moment, and then stated that his extensive acquaintance throughout the county would result in a great factor in his election. He also further said that there were many ex-office holders throughout the county who would gladly lend him their support inasmuch as he had aided them in their day of strife for political supremacy. "My declaration of principles at the election two years ago will also help me," said Mr. Vinson, "while the people of Douglas county are with me, and the only thing I fear is that the common people will not have time to reach the polls and cast their vote. Nevertheless I will make the race.

Mr. Vinson was a candidate before the primaries two years ago. There were six candidates in the field—two democrats, one socialist, and three republicans, all of whom were popular and influential men. In this election Mr. Vinson received the next highest vote cast without any organization of combined effort in his behalf, and the dignified manner in which he accepted his defeat, and the addressing of a letter through the columns of The News, thanking his many friends for their support, all tended to make him a popular man with the people of the county in which he has resided all his life.
