LOCAL NEWS.

 L. T. Crandall, of Redwing, Minnesota, is spending a few days in the city looking after business interests. Mr. Crandall owns considerable timber in Douglas county, and intends to hold the same until the market warrants its disposal.

The Roseburg "Ramblers" have made arrangements to meet the Glandale base ball aggregation, at the latter city, next Sunday afternoon. In the event the Roseburg boys win this contest they will be considered the champion team in Douglas county. Thus far this season the Roseburg team has met with great success, and has succeeded in defeating every aggregation of consequence in the county.

Dr. George A. Bradburn, one of Douglas county's best known fruit growers disposed of his beautiful 37 acre fruit ranch, situated in the vicinity of Edenbower, this morning, to F. D. Frisch, a recent arrival in this section of the West from Chicago, Ill. Mr. Frisch is a married man and will send for his family at once. The deal was consummated through the Harding Land Company.

Edward Riddle, who was at one time employed as fireman by the Southern Pacific Company, with headquarters in this city, arrived here yesterday afternoon from Riddle where he is visiting at the home of relatives. It will be remembered that Mr. Riddle lost a leg several years ago in a wreck which occurred near Shady Point, and later went to Klamath county where he resided until recently. During his brief stay here he met many of his old time friends.

Attorney C. S. Jackson received word from Judge Harris, of Eugene, this morning, to the effect that the case of F. G. McCell et al. vs Frank Andrus, had been decided favorable to the defendant. The action was brought about eighteen months ago by F. G. McCell and others, who alleged that the defendant persisted in appropriating sand and gravel from the river adjoining their property. They asked damages equal to the amount of material previously taken by the defendant, as well as a restraining order prohibiting him from trespassing on the land in question. In rendering his decision Judge Harris found no cause for action, and accordingly dismissed the case, and assessed the costs and disbursements of the suit against the plaintiffs. If it likely that the case will be appealed to the Supreme Court. The defendant was represented by Attorney C. S. Jackson.

The latest in "U'Renism" is at hand—and is in the form of innocent appearing postal cards received by local members of the bar this morning. It reads as follows: "I am a legal voter and agree with William Daly, Charles Grassman, William Noffke, J. F. Cassidy, Henry McGinn, W. H. Little, C. W. Bristol, H. J. Parkinson, Charles Schnabel, C. Joseph, Arthur Brock, Richard Montague and Dan Malarky, in seeking to obtain nomination by the voters of the republican, democratic and all other parties in Oregon, of the present Supreme Court judges, F. A. Moore, T. A. McBride, William R. King and W. T. Slater, to succeed themselves, at the regular November election this year, to the end that the judges of this court may be wholly free from partisan and political obligations. A blank is left for the signature of the attorney to whom the postal is sent, but in few instances are local attorneys swallowing the bait. Local members of the bar appear to consider U'Ren's motives as suspicious, and do not hesitate to say that the scheme is detestable, and a direct slap at the republican party of Oregon.
