GRANGEES GO ON RECORD.

Rescue Grange No. 420 Passes Stirring Resolutions.

LOOKING GLASS Or., July 15.—Rescue Grange No. 420 at a recent session passed the following resolutions:

Resolved, That to divide Douglas county will be detrimental to the farmers of the county.

Resolved, That to amend the constitution of the state of Oregon, as proposed, prohibiting the voters in the rural districts from voting on the question of the saloon in the incorporated towns and cities of a county, is not to the best interests of the farmers.

Resolved, That a copy of these resolutions be forwarded to the Master of the Oregon State Grange, with the request that they be placed before every Grange in the state, and with the further request from Rescue Grange No. 420 that members of the state organizations vote both of these measures down at the next general election.
