

Considering the amount of rubbish that was accumulated in many places, it is a fact that only for the firm determination of the forest service and their alds, many more private holdings would have been destroyed. They not only tried to help themselves but did their duty to stop the fire from burning private holdings. While I might (in my estimation) have done far better, I might have made many and larger mistakes. As reports are, the mistakes were many. I from an honest sandoolist, do not see so many.
