LOCAL NEWS.

Vivian French and wife have returned from their wedding trip to points in the northern part of the county.

H. Dyer and R. Fate, of Myrtle Creek, operating a grocery store under the firm name of H. Dyer & Company, brought suit in the circuit court of Douglas county late yesterday afternoon to recover the sum of \$143.55, alleged to be due from Arthur Miles, for merchandise furnished the defendant by the plaintiff. The plaintiff is represented by Attorney C. L. Leavengood.

Wm. F. Bernell, owner and operator of the two local theatres, has added another play house to his circuit, having made arrangements whereby he has control of the Oakland opera house, and will give the people of that vicinity an opportunity to witness a first-class performance at least once each week from now on. On Friday night of this week the attraction at the Roseburg theatre will be "A Texas Ranger", comprising a cast of eighteen people with their own band and orchestra, and the performance will be a good one. Friday evening of this week the Bernell Stock Co. will play at the Oakland theatre in "Burr Oaks."

Ell A. Smith, for many months a mail driver in Alaska, left Nome on November 14, 1905, and nearly two years later arrived at Washington, D. C. With him he brought his seven faithful dogs, and since his arrival in the United States has been exhibiting them in different theatres. Fortunately Mr. Bernell succeeded in obtaining the feature, and Mr. Smith and the animals will be seen at the Gem theatre for three nights, commencing this evening. He will tell you about his trip. Smith received a letter from President Roosevelt, a facsimile of which will be shown on the screen. The dogs carried by Mr. Smith attracted considerable attention his afternoon, and from appearances are of the true Alaskan type.

The first day's attendance at the various public schools in the city yesterday was highly satisfactory, aggregating considerably more than 100 above what it was on the first day of the school year for 1909. The High School building reported an enrollment, yesterday, of 342. The Lane school enrolled 423, West Roseburg 33 and Riverside 23, a total of 821 pupils for the opening day of the school year. In view of the fact that the school census for 1910 was reported to be a few less than for 1909, this increase of more than 100 over the first days attendance for 1909, seems proof that the number of scholars in the city has materially increased rather than diminished. All the rooms are crowded to their fullest capacity, and the school board is at wit end to know where to put the other hundred or two youngsters who will apply for admittance to the schools before the first month of this term is gone.

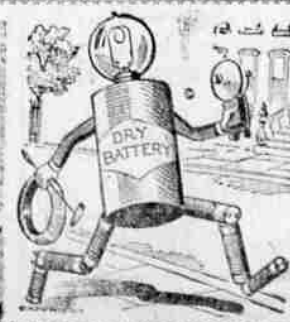
