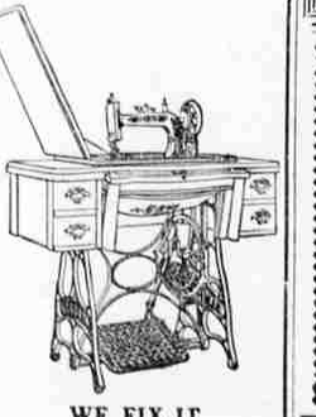

ing that the "cold storage" plant was being conducted "wide open" and that drinks were being served in the same fashion as in the days of the licensed saloon. It is also alleged that there are other resorts in Roseburg that are being conducted along shady lines, with beer and whiskey as the chief dispensing product. The "dry" element contend that the proprietors of the resorts referred to are carrying on their business without molestation, and that they are violating the local option laws every day without the least fear of the officers.

Notwithstanding that there are at present laws governing the sale of intoxicating liquors in "dry" territory, the advocates of a cleaner city, contend that the officers are not doing their duty, but on the contrary are passing by the flagrant violations without even attempting to detect the guilty parties.

A well known Roseburg citizen, known to be affiliated with the "wet" party, and a member of the Roseburg city council, when informed of the plan outlined by the "dry" element in preserving the local option law, asserted that he was pleased with the procedure, and as a member of the Roseburg municipal body, would lend whatever aid possible, in instituting a general "clean-up".

Indications are that the violators will be compelled to either resist future violations of the law, or cease business.

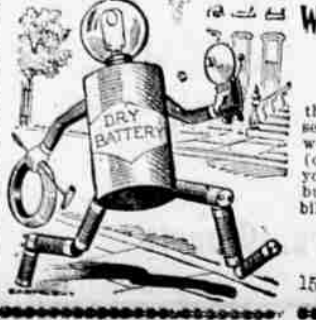
