POPULATION BY COUNTIES.

Seven Exceed the Twenty Thousand Mark.

By counties Multnomah, containing the city of Portland, leads with 226,261. In addition to Multnomah there are seven counties with population exceeding 20,000. These, in the order of their strength are: Marion, 35,780; Lane, 33,783; Clackamas, 29,931; Jackson, 25,756; Linn, 22,662; Washington, 21,522; Umatilla, 20,304.

Multnomah with 226,261 in 1910 had 193,167 in 1909 and 74,884 in 1890.

Lane with 33,783 in 1910 had 19,604 in 1909 and 15,198 in 1890. Clackamas with 29,931 in 1910 had 19,658 in 1909 and 15,233 in 1890.

Jackson with 25,756 in 1910 had 13,698 in 1909 and 11,455 in 1890. Linn with 22,662 in 1910 had 18,603 in 1909 and 16,265 in 1890. Washington with 21,522 in 1910 had 14,467 in 1909 and 11,972 in 1890.

Umatilla with 20,304 in 1910 had 18,949 in 1909 and 14,381 in 1890.

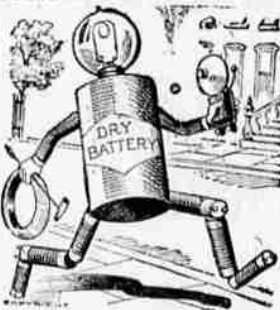
