GREAT FRUIT HARVEST. Some Figures on Product of the Northwest.

The crop of peaches, plums and apples for the season of 1910, in this great Northwestern country, is conservatively estimated from the most reliable sources at 25,000 carloads, of which 5,000 cars are peaches, pears and plums, the balance of 20,000 carloads consisting entirely of apples.

In regard to over-production, it should be said that this is not a new question. Fifty years ago, a pessimistic wall was going up that the apple business would soon be overdone, and would cease to be profitable.
