Accused of the crime of assault and battery C. F. Gadke, a local plumber, appeared in Justice of the Peace Marsters' court late Saturday afternoon, entered a plea of guilty, and was fined in the sum of \$15. The charge against Gadke was preferred by Mrs. Lillie Hull, formerly a waitress in the "Quick Lunch" restaurant.

Mr. and Mrs. T. J. Johnson, who own a nice little farm near Green Station left for Nebraska this morning. During their absence the farm here will be looked after by Mr. Atwater, their son-in-law. It is said that Mr. Elliott is an experienced lumberman, and that he will employ a large force of men as soon as the mill can be placed in readiness for operation. The deal was consummated through the Skelley Lumber Company's attorney, F. G. Micelli.
