The Hartford City, Indiana, News of recent date says:  
Mr. and Mrs. O. Anderson will depart May 12 on a trip to Oregon and others northwest states. They will be members of an excursion party now being organized by their son, Harmon Anderson, who is a real estate agent at Roseburg, Ore., and who expects to organize a colony of Oregon homeseekers among Hartford City residents.
