Accused of the crime of forgery. B. B. Stewart was arraigned in Justice of the Peace Reuben Marsters' court this morning, and upon waiving the formality of a preliminary hearing was held to appear before the grand jury in November. Unable to furnish bonds in the sum of \$500, Stewart will be compelled to remain in the county jail awaiting disposition at the hands of the officers. Stewart was arrested at Jacksonville a few days ago accused of uttering a forged check in the sum of \$12.50, and passing the same upon Wilson & Company, of Canyonville. The check was drawn on the Myrtle Creek State Bank and was purported to have been signed by H. B. Olcott, foreman of a recent grand jury. When arraigned this morning Stewart had little to say, other than relating meagre details pertaining to the transaction. Stewart was once previously arrested on a charge of forgery, but escaped punishment.

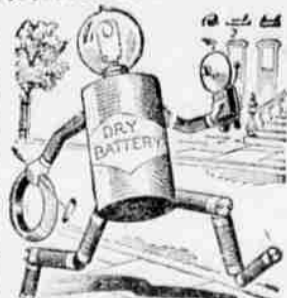

"After visiting fifteen of the principal cities of California and after observing the substantial progress being made, I have come to the conclusion that Roseburg needs three distinct improvements, including a gravity water system whereby pure water can be secured from the river above habitation; a city park where travelers and townspeople can rest, and third, a main driveway kept in the pink of condition during the entire year. In California the people take special pride in their driveways, parks and pure water, and it is partly through these essentials that thousands of tourists are attracted there during the year.

Oregonian: A man suspected as one of the robbers of the Heaton Limited, July 16, is in the Heaton county jail, awaiting arrival of Roseburg officers. He was arrested today by Sheriff Gollaty in Alsea Valley, where he has been working for a week. He answers closely the description published of the robber, who did the talking during the hold-up, except his voice is not low and weak. Eyes, nose, thin face, prominent Adam's apple, drooping upper lip, age and height answer the description exactly. None of the stolen mail and little money were on his person. He would talk but little to the sheriff but said that he came to Alsea from Florence, where he had lost his partner.
