STORE IS DAMAGED.

Fire Breaks Out After 3 O'clock This Morning.

Another fire occurred in Roseburg shortly after 3 o'clock this morning, when the music store, conducted by A. Lineback and situated in the R. B. Matthews building, on Cass street, was partially destroyed. The loss is estimated at approximately \$1,000, including the damage to his household furniture and musical instruments. Mr. Lineback carried \$500 insurance on his household goods and \$1,000 on his stock of musical instruments and sundries. R. B. Matthews, owner of the building, estimates his loss at about \$250, which is fully covered by insurance.

The flames were first discovered by Mrs. H. C. Stanton, who sleeps in a tent at the rear of her residence, on Jackson street, and almost directly behind the music store. At about 3 o'clock this morning she was awakened by peculiar noises, and upon investigating, discovered the rear of the Lineback store enveloped in flames. Hastening to a nearby telephone Mrs. Stanton gave the alarm with the result that the fire department responded promptly.

One line of hose was directed on the flames from the rear, while the chemical engine accomplished effective work in the interior. In less than a half hour the last spark was extinguished.

Interviewed this morning, Mr. Lineback stated that he and his wife entertained company last evening in their living rooms in the rear of the store, and left the establishment about 1 o'clock and went to the home of Mr. Maulding and family, in West Roseburg, where they spent the night. At the time they departed from the store he says there was no fire about the premises, other than a stick of wood which was smoldering in the cook stove.

The fire was confined to the living rooms of Mr. and Mrs. Lineback, and nothing of consequence was saved, other than a small refrigerator.

The work of repairing the building will be commenced just as soon as the adjusters can arrive and settle the losses.
