GAFFNEY KNOCKED OUT.

Only Lasts Five Rounds With Battling Nelson.

MEDFORD, Or., Aug. 4.—Doggedly fighting and conscientiously on the defensive, Tommy Gaffney, a Spokane lightweight, succumbed after being hammered for five rounds by Battling Nelson, at the opera house here tonight.

From the start, Gaffney did not have a chance. The minute he got into the ring he realized that Nelson was too much for him and the champion followed him constantly, tugging him in the body and trying to beat down his guarding gloves. At the first Nelson knocked Gaffney off his feet. In the fifth and last round Gaffney came up apparently stunned but he was knocked to the ropes and hung there for the count.

In the fifth an altercation occurred between Gaffney, his brother and referee Hamner, of this city, in which some promiscuous slugging was done. Gaffney declared the referee gave him a "rotten deal," not allowing a number of fouls on the part of the Dane.

Gaffney was in a bad condition at the finish, while Nelson was unscathed at the close of the fight. Nelson made a three-minute speech in which he declared that the bout with Gaffney was a feather of his condition and that being satisfied he was ready to try a tougher nut.

"I am going after my old position as the king of the lightweights ladies and gentlemen," he said. "And I am on my way."

There were about 500 spectators.

MUSICAL COMPANY LIBERAL.

sends Roseburg Band a New Horn Without a Murmur.

When William Burnell occupied the director's chair in the commercial club band, a number of band instruments were purchased from the Buescher Band Instrument Company, of Elkhart, Indiana. All of these instruments were found to be first class in every respect, with the possible exception of the baritone horn which for several reasons did not meet the approval of most of the band members. The particular style of horn sent was not authorized by the commercial club, although it was ordered by Mr. Burnell.

The Buescher people, learning this particular horn was not satisfactory to the band, offered to exchange the one if it was returned to the factory. The horn was returned, and the Buescher Company sent, prepaid, to the commercial club a new baritone horn, which is not only beautiful in appearance, but according to all the musicians who have examined it and tested it, is probably as fine a baritone as can be purchased in America.

The Buescher people probably could not have been required to exchange horns, as Mr. Burnell specified the instrument sent originally, but in order to satisfy the commercial club fully, they made the exchange, showing that they are not only ready.

ANOTHER RAILROAD.

Large Sum Raised To Promote New Road.

MARSHFIELD, Or., Aug. 4.—A \$5,000,000 mortgage has been filed in the office of the county clerk at Coquille on the franchises, rights of way and other property of the Coos Bay Traction Company. The mortgage is made in favor of the Northern Trust Company. The document does not indicate any particular route, further than that it is the intention of the company to build a railroad with a terminus at Coos Bay.

George F. Averill, of this city, who is now in Portland, is the president of the company. W. P. Evans, formerly of North Bend and now of Portland, is the secretary. Another railroad move was made in the filing of 12 rights-of-way agreements to the Coos Bay Eastern Electric Company. It is said that this company is the one for which Engineer Tarrant Aston, who was here recently, was making surveys. E. W. Nevers, of San Francisco, who a few weeks ago had a party of California men here, is said to be identified with the project. The rights-of-way agreements cover only certain points, some of which are on the same survey of the Coos Bay and Oregon Central. The rights of way specify a width of 300 feet.
