A trust deed and mortgage securing a bond issue in the sum of \$10,000,000 will be filed in the county clerk's office tomorrow morning at the invitation of Francis J. Clarke, promoter of the Coos Bay & Eastern Railway. The deed and mortgage is in favor of the Commonwealth Insurance Title and Trust Company of Philadelphia, Philadelphia, Pa., said to be one of the strongest banking institutions in the United States. The deed and mortgage cover the right-of-way, surveys and other assets of the Coos Bay & Eastern railway and is similar to the one filed at Coquille City a few days since.
