



SHOWING STONE'S PATENT GATE IN OPERATION.

GATE MANUFACTURING PLANT.
 Illinois Man Here and is Planning to Establish Factory.

Who is the man or woman, boy or girl, who has not enjoyed swinging on the old homestead gate at some period in their life. Those who have not had such pleasure missed a great deal of joy, and no doubt many have wrestled with the old time-worn bars that led to the cow pasture or the road, swearing audibly at the awkward clumsy things and wondering who would invent a better way of getting in and out of the premises. All sorts of gates have been built, to the one that drags on the ground and skins the toes of the boy who tries to open it, to the patent affair that is supposed to swing of itself and usually does not. But the problem seems to have finally been satisfactorily solved by Mr. W. G. Stone of Knoxville, Illinois, who has perfected a gate that meets the most exacting demands made upon it. Recently Mr. Stone came to Roseburg in search of a Western headquarters for a manufacturing plant. Delighted with the advantages that are offered here, Mr. Stone set up a model of the gate and has been exhibiting it

to farmers and interested parties for the past week or ten days. The model is a full sized farm gate and is made entirely of steel and steel wire, and is the only gate we have ever seen that can apparently be relied upon at all times.

The gate exhibited by Mr. Stone always opens in the opposite direction from approaching teams and is absolutely at the command of the operator at any stage of the opening process. It can be opened and closed from either side, which is a great advantage to any one driving stock as it can be opened sufficiently to allow one or more animals to pass, and if it is desired to hold others of the drove the gate can be instantly and easily swung back to its place. It is so adjusted that any child can operate it, and ones not have to alight from a horse or rig to get from or to the premises. This gate is operated by a hand-drop attached to a lever or arm, is a neat and ornamental affair, and any property owner might be proud to have his premises boast of such an excellent and labor-saving device. The model shown by Mr. Stone can be seen next to the Telephone building, on Stephens street, just south of Cass.

Mr. Stone, who patented the gate

also has other valuable patents in the way of mouse and gopher traps that are models of mechanical ingenuity. In addition to manufacturing gates the plant, if erected here, will be equipped to make various other articles that are every day necessities on the farm or in the home. There are certain parts of the gate that are made of cast steel, and Mr. Stone is at present negotiating with Portland and Eugene foundries in regard to castings, and if the steel can be had here at right quotations in order that the gates can be turned out to the farmer at attractive prices the plant will be established in Roseburg. The establishment will give employment to 40 or 50 men when fully equipped and running on full time. Mr. Stone anticipates a big demand for the output of the factory as he already has a lot of orders from people who have seen the model and want to see the gates in, and he believes the demand will steadily increase.
