Nature Has Been Lavish in Her Work
In This Section.

Having made a number of trips
out in the various valleys surround-
ing the city of Roseburg, my atten-
tion has been attracted to the vari-
ous products of the country. True,
the valleys are not large, but what
they lack in size seems to be made
up in fertility and productiveness.
Not only the valleys, but on the hills
abundance of evidence is to be seen
of what they are good for. The
large flocks of fat sheep and goats
dotting the many hills, with great
herds of sleek cattle and horses,
proving the richness and value even
of the steep and rugged hill lands.
Nature has been lavish in her work,
and where man has taken hold of
and met the conditions that con-
fronts him, a rich reward has been
the cheerful result. At visit to the
recent fair held here gave proof be-
yond all doubt of what the soil can
do when man does his part.

Fine vegetable fruits and grains
that were on exhibit, and the quality
of blooded stock and poultry, were
proof sufficient to satisfy anyone.
Strangers at the fair wondered
where all the people came from, as
from any one viewpoint there is
but little farming land in sight. Let
them take a buggy or auto ride up
Deer Creek, north and south, and
continue south-west through Roberts
Creek, also visiting the rich lands
near Dillard and Brockway, going
out to Olalla, taking a turn through
the beautiful Looking Glass valley,
and on down toward and through
Cleveland, and back by the Soldiers'
Home, and beautiful Edenbower.

This need not take but a day or
two and will give information that
will be of great help to one desiring
to become acquainted with the coun-
try surrounding Roseburg. These
are only a few of the nearest set-
tlements, but they are an indication
of many others just as fertile far-
ther out in all directions. Like spokes
in a wagon wheel, each supporting
the hub, and in this case Roseburg
is the hub and center of a wheel
of rich country. Why, then, in the dis-
position and general character of
the people inclined to be, and what
will the harvest be? When a thought-
ful person observes the great num-
ber of children and young men and
women attending the schools here,
the query comes up, what are the
parents and leading citizens doing to
mold and fix a good pure character
in each of this great army that are
soon to take the ruling of city and
country into their hands. A close
observer notices some corners and
fields of these rich valleys that, ne-
glected, are producing a rank growth
of crop-destroying weeds, and these
weeds produce seeds sufficient to
pollute all the farms in the whole
valley. As parents, citizens, tax
payers and ruling officials of city
and county, should we not look af-
ter the corners and conditions that
produce vile, corrupting and ruinous
seeds, that all too often find a grow-
ing place in the character and life
of the rising generation? The careful
and wise farmer will seek out and
destroy the vile and harmful weeds
before they bear seed. Why should
a wise father and mother allow
gambling dens and various other
hell-holes, exist in our city? Why
should the honest taxpayer wink at
and pass by places of pollution?
What are laws and officials for but
to root out and destroy all evil and
sin-producing places? The time has
come for a renovation. Who wants
a beer factory or joint? Echo says
"Who?" Who wants a gambling den
for their boys and girls to frequent?
How pure wholesome and elevating
are some of the shows and resorts at
times that are patronized by parents
with their lovely children all too of-
ten? How long will it take for us
to come to ourselves and really be
honest enough to see and admit the
sinful and viciousness of many
things that we have hitherto allow-
ed and encouraged by our money
and presence. We believe in pleas-
ure and real enjoyment, but God
help us, to cut out the vile, and any-
thing that has even the appearance
of evil. There are a great many
good people in the city that have lit-
tle interest in any of the churches
and seldom attend or contribute to
their support. I wish a committee
from that class of fathers and moth-
ers would get together and examine
some of the resorts that are fre-
quented by many of the young peo-
ple. I feel confident if they will do
this it will be such a revelation and
surprise that they will say to the
church people, "Let us help you
clean up our city and make it a
clean and fit place to rear and school
the young."
