John Beckley, a local Southern Pacific switchman, was arraigned before Justice of the Peace Reuben Marsters this morning on a charge of illegal fishing. Entering a plea of guilty he was fined \$50, and sentence was suspended. Beckley's arrest was caused by a special fish and game warden who has been spending the past few days in Roseburg.

The old Happy Valley ferry, which broke from its moorings several days since, came down the river late yesterday afternoon, and upon reaching the dam, a short distance south of town, was taken in tow by a number of fishermen. The men reported the incident to County Judge Wagoner, and he gave orders that the ferry be taken in operation at Happy Valley for several years, and was abandoned about eighteen months ago when it was supplemented by a new one.

point some distance north of the present depot, and was witnessed by quite a number of people who chanced to be in the vicinity at the time. According to the story told by a disinterested spectator, Lee and a companion were working about the train, when Schwartz, who was standing with a number of companions nearby, said something in which he mentioned the word "scabs". Apparently annoyed, Lee turned around, and whipping a revolver from his pocket, remarked: "Do you mean to call me a scab?" Schwartz responded: "I was not talking to you."

Following that Lee was an undesirable man to have in the vicinity. Schwartz immediately left the scene and went to the office of Justice of the Peace Marsters, where he caused a warrant to be issued for Lee's arrest. He is charged with assault on Constable Jarvis, who immediately instituted a search of the railroad yards in hope of apprehending him. Unable to locate the fellow, the constable later learned that he proceeded south on train No. 12, apparently in order to escape arrest. Constable Jarvis notified the officers at Riddle, but in some manner, the fellow succeeded in escaping detection at that place. Constable Jarvis hopes to capture him at either Grants Pass or Medford, and in the event he succeeds, he will be returned to Roseburg for trial. Lee resided in Roseburg and is well known in railroad circles.
