Upon being arraigned in Justice of the Peace Marsters' court following his arrest he entered a plea of not guilty and the preliminary hearing was set for tomorrow morning. Christie is accused of assaulting Joseph Powula, who was arrested on Sunday evening following an altercation in front of the Rapp rooming house. Not knowing the name of his assailant, Powula informed Justice Marsters that he could identify him in the event he was still in the city. Late yesterday Powula met Christie, and immediately informed the officers that he was the man wanted. The issuance of a warrant followed. Powula claims that he was emerging from the Rapp rooming house on Sunday night, when Christie approached and knocked him from the sidewalk. It was then he claims he ran to the opposite side of the street and fired his revolver. He says he meant no harm, but simply discharged the revolver with a view of attracting the officers' attention.
