FRUIT GROWERS EXPERIMENT

Wenatchee Orchardists Assisting Tree Growth—Lake Washington Ship Canal Will Be Built.

(Special to The Evening News.)
SEATTLE, Jan. 11.—H. L. Blanchard, of the Western Washington Experiment Station, estimates that during the last fifteen years, not less than \$20,000,000 has been sent out of this state for poultry and poultry products. For a long time it was believed that weather conditions throughout the Northwest were unfavorable to a profitable poultry industry. But the experiment station has entirely dispelled this erroneous notion. Its investigations demonstrate that chickens do exceptionally well here, if properly handled. In view of the growing population, Mr. Blanchard figures that during the next fifteen years, Washington will spend a hundred million dollars for poultry and poultry products. Hence, this industry is a promising one in which to engage. The experiment station has issued a new bulletin on the subject, which can be obtained on the asking.

Orchardists Try Experiment.
Fruit growers of Cashmere, in the Wenatchee valley, are to make a series of experiments with nitrate of soda, this spring. Horticultural authorities recommend a systematic addition of nitrogen to the soil, as promoting a rapid and healthy growth of wood and foliage, particularly during the young life of trees. The Cashmere orchardists have planned to try this out thoroughly. Careful records will be kept of the experiments.

Lake Washington Canal.
SEATTLE, Jan. 11.—The ship canal, connecting Puget Sound and Lake Washington, is to be ready for operation January 1, 1915. Bids will be opened for the digging of the canal next month. This part of the work is to be completed the middle of 1914. Half a million dollars is available for the contract. The locks are already under construction. The government has appropriated almost \$3,000,000 for this improvement, which means relatively as much to Puget Sound country as the Panama Canal does to the whole world. The Lake Washington canal will give to Seattle the distinction of having the largest fresh water harbor on the globe.

To Demonstrate Coal.
SEATTLE, Jan. 11.—Western coal operators have been invited to send representatives to Washington, D. C., to appear before the secretary of the navy, in regard to the use of Washington coal on vessels of the Pacific fleet. The department recently conducted a series of tests to determine the efficiency of western coals, and the result were not satisfactory to the naval authorities. However, members of the Washington delegation in congress are not satisfied that the best showing was made. They believe that Washington coal operators can better demonstrate their product and thereby stand a chance of enlisting the government in their favor.

DOUGLAS COUNTY FARMERS.
Attend Short Course at Agricultural College.

CORVALLIS, Or., Jan. 10.—Today I had an opportunity of looking over the slips of the "short students," as the people taking the short courses are called, and the following are registered from Douglas county: In the department of domestic science: Misses Alto Drain, of Drain, and Helen G. Kenny, of Leona, are both improving the opportunity of becoming expert in the science of housekeeping and kindred arts. Engineering and mechanics arts claim two of Douglas county's young men in the persons of Ralph Karcher and Wm. Melton, Jr., both of South Deer Creek. These two young men are not only busy all day long, but have classes that keep them busy from 7 till 9 o'clock each evening of the week. The largest number of our county's representatives, however, are taking the agricultural and horticultural courses and the following residents are here for that purpose: Jesse A. Imrie, Melrose; Dr. C. H. Bailey, South Deer Creek; John A. Jaquins, Melrose; Wm. A. Karcher, South Deer Creek; Geo. H. Perkins, Drain; Eugene R. Kenny, Leona; Stephen L.

Luse, Oakland; W. C. Winston, Roseburg.
The scope of the work offered in the short courses embraces 52 different subjects, and there are 350 persons here to take advantage of this opportunity of becoming up-to-date in subjects of vital interest, especially to the successful farmer and fruit grower. Farm botany, farm drainage, farm management, farm mechanics, diseases and insects attacking the field crops, forage and seed crops and weed eradication are gone into exhaustively, and would be of vital importance to the development of Douglas county if understood by the majority of the farmers from a scientific point of view. The stock raiser would find a great deal to interest him in the courses on horses, sheep, swine, veterinary science and poultry raising. For women who enter the short course the college offers branches in dress-making, fancy cooking, general and special food preparation, home management, millinery, the principles of laundering, sewing and special food preparation. There are also short courses in piano, violin, hand instruments, harmony history of music and voice culture for those interested in music.

There are representatives from most of the large Eastern Universities and colleges taking the short courses, while the graduates of the leading business colleges of the state are also represented. About 175 men and women are enrolled in the horticultural course, while about an equal number are registered in dairying and animal husbandry. Eleven states are represented in the short, though by far the larger number are residents of Oregon. Japan, Germany, British Columbia, Switzerland and England are also represented.

Many of the short course students are taking the various courses for the second or third time. The fact that they have made good from knowledge obtained from previous courses has opened their eyes to the fact that a man or woman cannot do better than to spend four or five weeks during the fall season of the year in perfecting their knowledge of the science and art of a culture.

THE CITY'S LEVY.

Based upon the present valuations of taxable property in the city of Roseburg, exclusive of corporations, the 10 mill tax recently levied by the city council will raise approximately \$2,063,600, while the armory levy of one mill will raise \$2,553,360. Enhanced by the tax of corporations, the city will probably realize about \$23,000 for municipal purposes, together with about \$4,000 for armory purposes.

GALLOWAY'S DECISION.

In Referendum Case Arouses Enthusiasm at U. of O.

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Jan. 11.—With the enthusiasm inspired by Judge Galloway's favorable decision in the University of Oregon referendum case, plans at the University have taken on new life. On account of the hold up of the appropriation bills of the last legislature by the forged referendum petitions, the University has been greatly handicapped in the fall semester's work. Several additional professors needed were not procured, with the result that classes have been crowded and teachers overworked. Another handicap has been cramped class room space. Dady Hall and McClure Hall, which are now used from attic to cellar, are antiquated structures without modern conveniences. The Library Building, Villard Hall, the engineering buildings, and the symposium, which are modern have not the capacity needed. It is expected that the supreme court will uphold the emphatic decision.
