Lake Washington Canal. SEATTLE, Jan. 11.—The ship canal, connecting Puget Sound and Lake Washington, is to be ready for operation January 1, 1915. Bids will be opened for the digging of the canal next month. This part of the order is to be completed the middle of 1914. Half a million dollars is available for the contract. The locks are already under construction. The government has appropriated almost \$3,000,900 for this improvement, which means relatively as much to Parzet Scund country as the Panama Canal does to the whole world.
