

HERE'S SOME FAMILY.

Couple At Webster City, Iowa, Have 51 Children.

WEBSTER CITY, Iowa, Feb. 7.—When it comes to Rooseveltian families Mr. and Mrs. J. Benham, of this city, have a claim to unusual consideration, not only in Iowa, but in the United States as well.

The Benhams are an aged couple and live over the Salvation Army headquarters on Seneca street. Not all these fifty-one children are their own, however. Here is the way the record is made up:

Mrs. Benham has been married three times. When she married her first husband he already had been married five times and had twenty-five children. Two were born of their union, making a total of twenty-seven children.

When Mrs. Benham married a second time she married a man with sixteen children, bringing the total up to forty-three. Six were born of this union, making forty-nine. Her third husband, Mr. Benham, had no children, but to Mr. and Mrs. Benham were born two little ones, making the grand total of fifty-one, of whom Mrs. Benham herself is the actual mother of but ten.

ELECTION IS COSTLY.

SALEM, Or., Feb. 12.—One hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars is the estimate made of the cost of the primary and general election for the state by officials of the secretary of state's office. There are 1082 precincts in the state and it is estimated that the expenditures for clerks and judges will be \$77,902. At the last election it cost the state \$1,538 for the corrupt practices act pamphlets for the primary election and \$4,436 for the general election, and \$18,425 for the initiative and referendum pamphlets. It is estimated that the cost will be just as much, if not greater, for the coming election. The cost of the ballots is placed between \$15,000 and \$20,000. For pencils and sundries the cost last year was \$500 and for tally books \$5,000. In view of these figures in the past and that new precincts have been created and the state has grown, it is estimated the cost, at the lowest figure, will be \$125,000.

It is said that much of the land will be sold in small tracts, and that is expected to bring a great many new settlers into this place.
