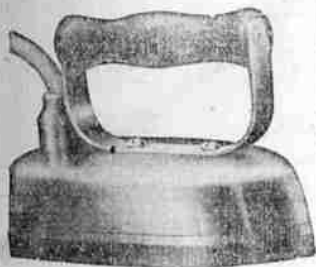


GUN CLUB SHOOT.

MEXICO IS GIVEN

Ultimatum Concerning Protection of Americans

MADERO AND REBELS NOTIFIED

Killing of American Who Enlisted With Federals Gave Rise To The Action of The United States.

(Special to The Evening News.)

WASHINGTON, April 15.—Aroused over the murder of Thomas Fontana, the American gunner, who enlisted for service in the federal army, and who later was captured by revolutionists and by them executed, the state department today issued an ultimatum to President Madero, and also to the rebel chief, Gen. Orozco, demanding that Mexico protect all American citizens within its borders.

Accept Wage Scale Compromise.

INDIANAPOLIS, April 15.—Provision for two years of peace in the bituminous coal fields was made today in the approval by referendum vote of the miners of the bituminous wage scale compromise. The agreement thus reached is better for the miners and operators alike, and provides for an increase in wages of five cents per ton for mining screened coal, and three cents per ton for unscreened coal. All helpers and drivers, and other men employed in the mines are to receive an increase of five and one-fourth per cent in wages.

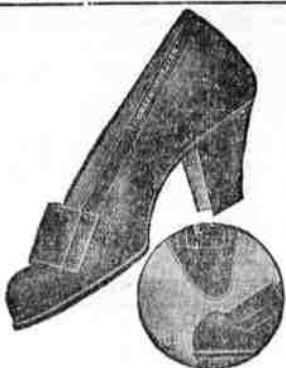
