## MILLER WINNER

Defeats B. S. Nichols by Thirty Four Votes.

OVER 500 VOTES ARE CAST

School Clerk George Neuner Submits Report Showing Financial Condition of the City—Adopted and Filed.

In one of the most spirited school elections ever held in Roseburg Dr. K. L. Miller yesterday defeated B. S. Nichols, the retiring director, by a vote of 274 to 240. In all there were 519 votes cast, five of which were found to be irregular. The newly elected director will serve for a term of five years.

Other than electing a director, the voters also considered a report submitted by School Clerk Geo. Neuner. The report follows:

To the Board of School Directors and citizens of School District No. 4, Douglas County, Oregon:

I herewith submit to you, as required by law, the annual report of the schools in district No. 4 for the year ending the 3rd Monday in June, 1911, showing the financial and general conditions of said district.

Number of persons between 4 and 20 years of age residing in the district at the time of this report, as shown by the last census 1,566

Number of teachers employed during the year in the schools 24

Of which 4 are male teachers 20 females

Average monthly salaries of male teachers \$ 105.00

Average monthly salary of female teachers 62.75

The total indebtedness of school district No. 4 including a \$25,000.00 bond issue, authorized by the legal voters of said district on the 16th day of December, 1911 amounts to \$42,200.00, and is as follows:

Of the \$35,000.00 indebtedness voted by the district, \$19,000.00 worth of warrants have been issued to date, and are included in the above financial statement. \$16,000.00 worth are yet to be issued.

You will not that the item, "monuments of grounds and janitor work," which amounts to \$7,431.85, includes the following:

\$2,000.00 paid out for an addition to the West Side school.

\$1,141.52 paid out for paying of West Douglas street abutting the Lane school property.

\$1,600 paid out for retaining wall and sidewalk abutting on Lane school property.

\$131.15 paid out for sewer assessment on the High school property.

\$255.00 for graveling West Side school grounds.

At the present time there are four school houses within the district and in the course of construction. It is estimated that additional buildings will be required for the ensuing year, for the reason that our new school building, when constructed, will greatly relieve the congested conditions and fewer rooms will be used in that a number of the rooms used last year were small library and basement rooms. Our present building is a fine one and will be used for the four-year course in the new building.

Work of Remodeling The Old Methodist Building Awarded To F. F. Patterson.

An agreement of construction contract has been awarded to moving the old brick and oak frame structure to A. D. Moody of Portland who would commence operations at once. Resolving in the foundation of the old building on the site back of the Church store has been let to Mr. Troxel, of this city. As soon as the foundation can be built the old structure will be moved across the street.

Plans for the new hotel are nearing completion, and will be ready within the next ten days. Bids for construction work will then be accepted and work rushed along.

All labor and material that can be had in Roseburg is being used by Mr. Roberts' local superintendent, and it is the policy of the company to employ Roseburg men as much as possible. This feature of the work will be appreciated by local people.
