Camille Flammarion, the Famous French Astronomer

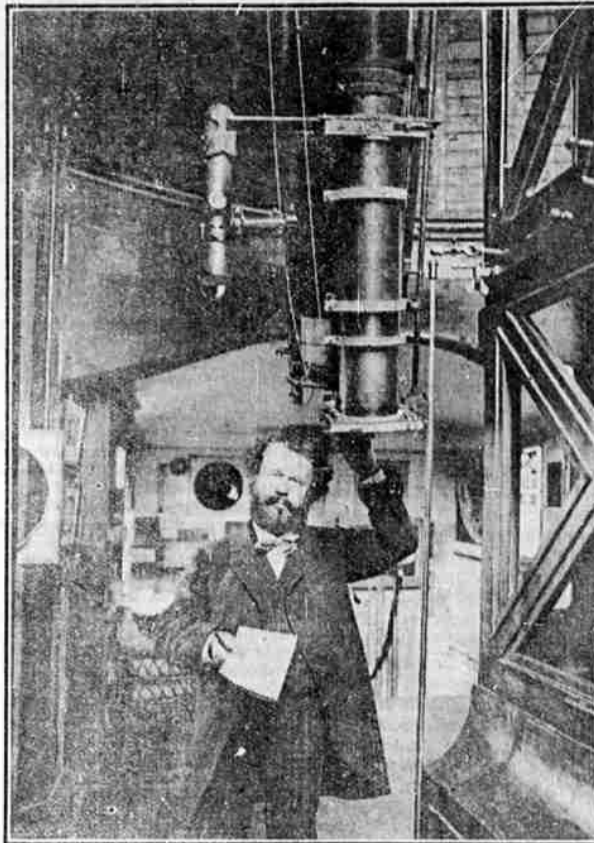

CAMILLE FLAMMARION, the best known of French astronomers, recently celebrated the fiftieth anniversary of the publication of his first book, "The Plurality of Inhabited Worlds," written when he was only twenty years old. He is the director of the Juvisy observatory, near Paris, and the accompanying photograph shows him beside his great telescope at the time of the recent eclipse of the sun. M. Flammarion has become one of the most talked about astronomers in the world. This is due to his voluminous writings and the fact that he has propounded various fanciful theories of the constitution of the heavenly bodies, besides putting forward extraordinary suggestions for the utilization of natural forces. One of the most remarkable of these suggestions was that for the digging of a huge hole, deeper than any existing mine, which should make it possible to draw upon the internal heat of the earth for running the industries of the world. M. Flammarion is also an ardent spiritualist and has devoted much attention to psychical research. At his "jubilee" official delegates from all the great scientific bodies of the world were present to do him honor.

May 20 choice timothy hay was priced at \$26.50 on the St. Paul market. This indicates a situation that should contain several pointers and suggestions for the north state farmer.

The fellow who left his reaper right where he got through using it last summer and hasn't made a move to put it under shelter to date can be counted on to be blaming the party in power for his bad luck before many moons roll around.

It is beyond question that the decrease in the supply of western cattle is directly traceable to the breking up of many of the big ranges of the west and the substitution by thousands of homesteaders of a grain raising in stead of a pastoral type of farming.

The northwestern products exposition which is to be held in Minneapolis the coming November has offered a prize of \$5,000 for the best five bushels of wheat grown in the United States and accompanied by five sheaves of wheat from the same field from which the grain was thrashed.

The lower house of congress has passed a bill which if enacted into law will mean the granting of a subsidy of from \$15 to \$25 per mile on all roads over the country at present used in the free delivery of rural mail. It is estimated that the expenditure the first year for this purpose will total \$16,000,000.

The Utah experiment station is this year seeking to arouse interest in potato growing over the state by offering prizes to boys' clubs that take up the work under the supervision of the station. This is a very wholesome sort of stimulus and is not only going to be a good thing for the potatoes, but also for the boys.
