Ambrose, Sr., of Yoncalla; Nathan Ambrose, of Woodlawn; E. Ambrose, of Yoncalla; Mrs. J. W. Wise, and Mrs. R. W. Long, of Yoncalla. The sympathy of the community is extended to the bereaved families and relatives.
