

GRAFT CHARGED

Many Detroit Aldermen Placed Under Arrest

JUDGE BORDWELL IS ON STAND

Contradicts Evidence Given By Steffins, a Magazine Writer—Haytli Has a New President Today.

(Special to The Evening News.)
DETROIT, Aug. 9.—Aldermen Hindle, Mason and Koenig were arrested here last night charged with participating in a graft that has flourished in this city for years. Neither of the men would make any statement. Charged with being implicated in the same graft, Alderman Brazo, Walsh and Tossyre were placed under arrest this morning, but all of them refused to discuss the matter with newspaper correspondents. Fifteen other warrants have been issued as a result of new and sensational evidence unearthed, and nine of these warrants were served today. The charge was "suspicious of graft from the Wabash." Five of the first lot arrested were openly charged with bribery. By tonight it is believed

that 21 city officials will be under arrest.
Bordwell Contradicts Steffins.
LOS ANGELES, Aug. 9.—Judge Walter Bordwell was called by the state to impeach the testimony of Lincoln Steffins, the magazine writer. Bordwell was the presiding judge in the McNamara trial, and in contradicting the testimony offered by Steffins, swore that he had not discussed with Steffins, prior to the time McNamara plead guilty, any plan for them to so plead.
New President For Haytli.
PORT AU PRINCE, Aug. 9.—General Tancer de Auguste was today appointed president of Haytli to succeed Cincinnatus Leconte, killed in the explosion and fire which destroyed the palace yesterday.

BECOMES A MEMBER OF THE C. C. OF U. S.

Portland Chamber of Commerce Recently Elected To National Organization.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 3.—The Chamber of Commerce, of Portland, Ore., with 900 members has now been elected to membership in the Chamber of Commerce of the United States of America.

Though the National Chamber was organized as recently as April 22nd, more than 77,000 business men of the nation are now affiliated with it through 102 different organizations covering 29 individual states and the Hawaiian Islands. The Chamber of Commerce of Alexandria, Va., with

52 members, is the smallest local organization that has so far joined; the Chamber of Commerce of Boston, Mass., with 4,609 members, is the greatest. The National Association of Glue and Gelatin Manufacturers of New York, with 36 members, is the smallest national body that has so far become affiliated. The next in size is the United States Potters' Association with 58 members.

The detail work of the National Chamber is being carried on by the following men: General Secretary, Elliott H. Goodwin, formerly secretary of the National Civil Service Reform League; field secretary, Edward F. Trefz, formerly advertising counselor to the Painted Display Advertising Association of the United States; assistant secretary, D. A. Skinner, formerly assistant chief bureau of manufacturers, department of commerce and labor; chief of editorial division and editor of "The Nation's Business", G. Grosvenor Dawe, formerly managing director of the Southern Commercial Congress.
