Cookery Points

The School Lunch

Sandwiches are the standby for the school lunch. Variety in the kinds of bread used is most desirable. Nearly every kind of ment is usable, and there are also the various pastes made from all sorts of scraps and leftovers to the ment line, put through the chopping michine and sensoned to suit the chil-dren's tastes. Cold chicken, roast beef, iamb, bam and even thin slices of beef steak (wrapped in parailin papers help to add to the variety and are alway acceptable. It is a good idea to save all the paper from the cracker boxes and use it to wrap the different articles In, so that they do not taste of one an

A most delicious filling for graham sandwiches is made of cream cheese to which have been added some chopped nut meats, oilves or a wee bit of green pepper. For another good filling take yolks of hard boiled eggs, add pep per and salt and a tiny pinch of curry powder. Mix to a paste and spread rather thick. These may be varied by a little catsup or sauce of any kind in powder. stend of the curry.

Hard boiled eggs from which the alks have been removed may be stuff with spinach, seasoned to taste or with chopped nut meats, cold ham or celery dressed with either mayonnaise or French dressing. Another way is to stuff them with chipped ham mixed with a bit of the yolk and vinegar, pep per and sait, or just cheese and unyon natse may be used.

Helow are given the menus for a week's lunches, which could, however, be varied indefinitely:

Monday,-Bread and cheese sand wiches, sliced chicken (from Sunday's dinners, celery tips, nut and apple salas din a glass bottler, piece of chocolate ake and an orange. Tuesday.—Grahum bread and cream

cheese sandwiches, clam broth in a vacuum bottle, olives, sweet crackers gs and an orange. Wednesday.—Cold roast beef sand

wiches (made of rolls), cabbage saind tin bottlet, dates, a piece of cake and Thursday. - Deviled meat sandwiches

baked apple or apple stace (in bottle), salted or fresh peanuts, cookles, milk chocolate and an orange.

Friday.—Egg sandwiches (unde from yolks), stuffed eggs (using one of the fillings suggested previously), chicken broth in the vacuum bottle, cracker tacts and an apple.

Potato Pancakes.

For three potatoes weighing about a half pound each allow two or three eggs, one-half cupful of milk, one level tenspsonful of salt and, if neces-sary, a very little floor. Grate the potatoes (raw) in a pan

of cold water, let stand a few minutes then drain, put potatoes with the starch that remained at the bottom of the pan in a cheesecloth bag, squeen out all water, then put back the points with the other ingredients and fry the cakes as you would wheat cakes in hot

Ginger Lonf.

Place in a low! a cupful each of molasses and cour cream and mix into this two rounding cupfuls of flour sifted with two level teaspoonfuls of oda, the same of ginger and a little alt. Add a well beaten egg, mix thor oughly and bake.

Wash rice, mix ingredients and pour into buttered poulding dish. Bake three hours in very slow oven, stirring three times during first bour of baking to prevent rice from settling.

Fine Spange Cake,

Take the whites of twenty eggs, two gobletfuls of flour, three of pulverized sugar, two teaspeonfuls of extract of lemon and one of cream of tartar Sift the flour carefully, mis the sugar, care and lemon thoroughly and stir in the gradually, taking core not to toughen it by too much benting. The great test is in the tecking. The even should be very test, and the cake should be baked only a few minutes, until it is a light brown

Grapefruit Sauce

One grapefruit, two bunkons and one entrol of preserved planeapple are osquised. Separate the grapefruit into corticls and sample the fruit into 4 dish discarding all peet and linings. Peel the lammus, split them length sche into quarters and then slice ere who into the dish with the grapefruit. Add the pineappie and sugar to taste and mix slightly. Serve with springe

German Nut Loaf,

German Nut Leaf,
Sift together four cut-fuls of flour,
four heaping tenapoonfuls baking powder, half cupful sugar, tenapounful
sait, one cupful chopped walnuts, one cupful raisins, one egg, well beaten, and two cupfuls milk. Mix well tocupfuls milk. gether and put in bottered pans and allow to stand twenty minutes. Bake in moderate oven forty-five minutes. Serve in thin slices with butter.


