

WRITE ON HELPFUL SUBJECTS.

Young Authors At O. A. C. Publish Practical Articles In College Magazine.

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, Ore., Dec. 21.—Seventeen well-written articles on practical applications of science to home and farm problems, most them written by students of the Oregon Agricultural College, appear in the current issue of the Oregon Countryman just off the press.

With the exception of an article on "The Cabbage Aphid" by A. L. Lovett of the crop pest force and one by Dr. James Withington on "A New Vision of Agriculture," the students have had entire charge of the authorship, editorial work and make-up of the magazine, which is illustrated this month by 15 halftone engravings.

H. C. Hetzel, a student from Madison, Wis., has an article "Co-operation," a subject on which he spoke at the Portland Land Products Show, winning a \$50 prize. S. J. Damon, Ferndale, Calif., writes on "Breeding and Selection of Jerseys," and Blaine Ferguson, Boise, Ida., on "Why We Plow."

Waldemar Wilkelling, New York, N. Y., has an article on "How To Obtain Agricultural Publications," and an article on winter egg production, "Better Eggs and More of Them" is by C. M. Wilcox, Portland. An interesting article on "Mammitis-Sore Udder" is contributed by C. P. Moffit of Junction City, and George Mognette of Vancouver, Wash., has another on "The Rodent Enemies of Fruit Trees." "Landscape Gardening and The Farm Home" is by L. R. Hartill, Brooklyn, N. Y.

The young women have made their department eminently suited to the

"Christmas Presents," written by Miriam Allen, Bend, and Elizabeth Buchanan, Corvallis, tells in detail how to make a girl's work bag, an adjustable book rack, a crochet napkin ring, a baby's football, an Irish crochet bag and other gifts. Lucy Crawford, Ashland, tells of "Amusements For the Children," and Mary Hartong, Eugene, describes the making of Christmas Candles. "The use of Christmas Leftovers" is a bit of economy by Edna Groves, Corvallis. Margaret McCall, Selo, describes the work in home economies to be given in the winter short course, and Helen Clarke, Grants Pass, writes on "The Christmas Dinner." There are several other interesting features in the issue.
