MACHINERY HALL.

Will Be a Large Structure at the Panama Exposition.

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 21.—Bids will be received for the construction of the Machinery Hall of the Panama-Pacific International Exposition on December 28th and ground will be broken for the immense structure at Harbor View on New Year's day. The specifications cover 100 pages and here are 24 blue prints, measuring

four to six feet long. The interior arrangement consists of three great naves, seventy feet in width and over nine hundred feet in length, rising to a height of over 100 feet above the floor, producing a very dignified effect. It is expected that this structure will be completed at least a year and a half before the opening of the exposition, which will allow more than ample time for the installation of exhibits.
