las county, Oregon; that the enterprise, business, pursuit and purpose in which said corporation proposed to engage by its Articles of Incorporation, was the enterprise, business and

pursuit of carrying on a general brewing establishment in all its branches, and particularly the manufacturing of beer as a beverage with the purpose of selling the same at wholesale or retail or both throughout all parts of the state of Oregon.

That contrary to the terms of its charter and, by willfully, wrongfully and unlawfully exercising privileges not conferred upon it by law, and by unlawfully, wrongfully and willfully misusing and abusing the terms of its franchise, the said Roseburg Brewing & Ice Company brought large quantities of beer outside of Douglas county, Oregon and brought the same into the said Douglas County, state of Oregon and sold the same contrary to the terms of the Local Option Liquor Law, the said Roseburg Brewing & Ice Company having bought from the Salem Brewing Company during the year 1911 more than seven hundred barrels of beer and had the same shipped to said Douglas county, Oregon, where the said defendant sold the same contrary to the Local Option Liquor Law; and the defendant purchased large quantities of beer, the exact amount being to the Prosecuting Attorney unknown, from the Northern Pacific Brewing Company and had the same shipped to Roseburg, Douglas Co., Oregon, and sold the same contrary to the local option liquor law.

Inasmuch as the attorneys for the defense will be given time to answer the complaint filed by the district attorney today it is not likely that the quo-warranto proceedings against the brewery will come up for final disposition until February. At that session of court the case pending against Mayor Joseph Micelli will also be tried.
