Prohibited by the authorities from holding a meeting of the Irish Transport Worker's Union, of which he is secretary, Mr. James Larkin, vowed to appear at Sackville street, Dublin, despite the

for his arrest. By adopting the disguise in which he is seen above he was able to carry out his threat. On the morning of the serious riots an apparently old and feeble bearded man took a room at the Imperial hotel in Sackville street. Shortly afterwards this venerable gentleman stepped on the balcony and announced "I am Larkin," began to address the crowds in the street below, "then instantly entered the hotel and faced him under arrest.

Drugless Healers Convention.

SEATTLE, WASH., Sept. 18.—Legislation which will legalize the practice of several systems of drugless healing was demanded today by speakers at the annual convention of the Washington Association of Drugless Healers which opened today to continue two days. The speakers declared that jealousy, narrowness and ignorance were the chief causes why such legislation has not long ago been passed. They pointed to innumerable instances in which deformities, many forms of disease and breaks and certain kinds of wounds have been permanently cured by different systems of drugless healing. During the convention which opened today there will be several clinics to demonstrate "the efficiency claimed for the drugless method of healing and treating chronic diseases and deformities; physiological treatment and exercises; scientific food chemistry and hygienic measures."

Trade Press Association Meets.

NEW YORK, Sept. 18.—Leading editors, business managers, buyers and sellers of advertising, and authorities on modern merchandising methods gathered here today from all over the United States to attend the eighth annual convention of the Federation of the Trade Press Associations. The federation includes the New York, New England, Chicago, St. Louis-Southwestern and Philadelphia Trade Press Associations, and a number of unaffiliated publications. The total membership represented today was 236, representing over seventy-five different trades, industries and professions. Scores of manufacturers, sales managers, advertising men and others interested in the idea of business promotion through trade press efficiency attended on invitations sent

out some weeks ago on the recommendation of H. M. Swetland, president of the federation. There was two business sessions today including symposiums of discuss editorial policy, circulation, advertising and publishing questions.
