Works Hardship on Those Matrimonially Inclined.

EXAMINATION IS DEMANDED

Heavy Penalties Attached for Violation of The Law—Weddings Outside of State Are Held Invalid.

MILWAUKEE, Sept. 24.—(AP)—Congressional action has been taken to amend the laws of the state in regard to the validity of marriages contracted outside of the state. The amendment provides that any marriage contracted outside of the state shall be invalid unless the parties thereto have been domiciled in this state for a period of at least six months immediately preceding the date of the marriage. This amendment is designed to prevent the practice of some persons of contracting marriages in foreign countries in order to evade the laws of this state. The amendment also provides that any person who contracts a marriage outside of the state in violation of the law shall be liable to a fine of not more than \$100 and to imprisonment for not more than six months.
