POWERS TO SUE

Governor West on Charge of Criminal Libel.

GRAVES CASE IS CONTENTION

McLaughlin Admits That Contents of His Affidavit Was Based on Hearsay—Echoes of Leach Deportation.

(Special to The Evening News.)
MARSHFIELD, Ore., Oct. 9.—The hearing of Attorney O. D. Graves, whom Governor West would disbar from practicing law in Oregon, for the part the former is alleged to have played in the recent deportation of Dr. Leach, is progressing here today.

From what can be gathered, Mr. McLaughlin, who furnished the affidavit on which the prosecution was based, has admitted that the contents of his charge was wholly hearsay. In fact, Mr. McLaughlin has even gone further in admitting

that he was absent from town on the day the deportation occurred. A large number of witnesses are here for examination, including persons from every section of the county. It is not believed here that Graves faces any immediate danger of being disbarred.

It is rumored here today that Al Powers intends to bring suit for criminal libel against Governor West. This suit will be based, it is said upon accusations alleged to have been made by the governor against Powers.

G. P. SCHLOSSER IS APPOINTED DELEGATE
