LAY IN YOUR FUEL SAYS THE WEATHER SHARPS

Flies Have Been Scarce, Insects Retired Early, Groundhogs Go Deep and Trees Hold Leaves.

READING, Pa., Nov. 2.—Fill your coal bins and make other preparations for a severe winter. These timely warnings are sounded following the annual meeting of the weather prophets of Berks county, held at Virginsville, nine miles north of Reading. For the first time in many years the weather prognosticators of this section, who have been meeting in annual session for the past 15 years periodically, agree in predicting a severe winter.

One reason given for cold weather this winter is that not for many years have flies been as scarce as they have been this year. Caterpillars wasps and other insects disappeared earlier than usual.

Samuel F. Glass, of Athol, who has been forecasting winter weather for 45 years said: "I find that the groundhogs in my section have gone exceptionally deep this fall, and that is a sure sign of a hard winter. The leaves are clinging to the trees longer than usual this fall, and this is another indication of intensely cold weather, with plenty of snow. I have

noticed during the past 40 years that whenever the trees and plants retain their leaves the winter will be a severe one."

REFERENDUM ELECTION TO BE HELD THROUGHOUT THE STATE TOMORROW

Five Measures Are to be Submitted To Voters of the State for Approval or Rejection.

Tomorrow occurs the special referendum election, the first of its kind held in the state of Oregon since

the initiative and referendum law became effective.

From a careful canvass locally it is believed that the voters of Douglas county will uphold the university bills, the county attorney bill, and last but not least the sterilization measure. While there are some people who doubt the constitutionality of the latter bill they are determined to vote yes and thereby repudiate the abuse to which the referendum law has been subjected by a few Portland individuals, who apparently have a personal axe to grind.

The polls will open, at the usual hour and will remain open until tomorrow evening at seven o'clock.

The ballot boxes have been distributed, the election boards have been appointed, and everything is in readiness for the affair. That little interest will be manifest in the election in Roseburg is the prediction of those who claim to be close in touch with the situation.
