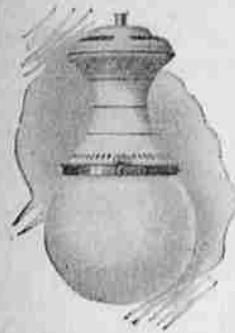

Sites and Forests Will Demand  
Attention.

**U. S. AVIATION CORPS IS PROPOSED**

Secretary of the Navy Daniels in  
Conference With Airmen at  
St. Louis—Volunteers  
For Service.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18.—National control of conservation work in opposition to the state rights plan loomed large as one of the most vital problems before the annual meeting of the National Conservation Congress which opened here today. With more than 1,000 delegates present from all sections of the country led by Gifford Pinchot and Charles L. Pack, there was a strong prospect of a forceful movement for exclusive national supervision of conservation. Leaders, however, at the outset looked for a bitter contest on this proposal. Speakers today declared that the regular session of congress will have many problems involving this issue, with forest and water power grabbers seeking to influence against the national control.

Another important phase of the convention schedule is the proposed discussion of fire waste prevention in cities and forests. The delegates sought today to organize a movement to minimize the nation's vast annual losses from preventable conflagration. Announcement was made that the recently organized state conservation bodies have assailed materially in spreading conservation doctrines. This work in the coming year will be extended.

ST. LOUIS, Nov. 18.—Secretary of the Navy, Josephus Daniels, today arrived in St. Louis to confer with millionaire aviator Albert Bond Lambert for completion of the organization of Lambert's project for the formation of a United States aviation reserve corps, proposed several weeks ago by the St. Louis aviator, and tenta-

tively approved by Washington. Lambert's project has already advanced so far that eighteen airmen have volunteered their services to the government in case of war as follows: Lambert, Anthony Jannus, Hugh Robinson, Hillery Beachy, William H. Bleakley, William Assmann, Paul McCallough and H. E. Honeywell, all of St. Louis. The last three named are balloonists. Others are Lincoln Beachy, W. R. Brookins and Francis Wildman, all of New York; Charles P. Willard, Harry Holmes, Roy Knudsenhue, D. P. Williams, George D. Harrison, Glen Martin, all of California, and Dr. Lloyd Thompson, of Chicago. When Lambert first suggested organization of an aviation reserve corps he called attention to the fact that France has now 600 aviators and machines ready for war as compared to twenty-two aviators comprising the army and navy signal corps. Secretary Daniels will be a guest of Lambert while here.

Majority for measure, 16,959. Appropriation of \$100,000 for erecting administration and classroom building at the University of Oregon—For, 53,569; against, 43,914. Majority for measure, 10,555. Sterilization bill—For, 41,767; against, 53,319. Majority against measure, 11,552. Act creating offices of district attorney in counties—For 54,179; against, 38,159. Majority for measure, 16,020. Workmen's compensation act—For, 67,814; against, 28,608. Majority for measure, 39,206.

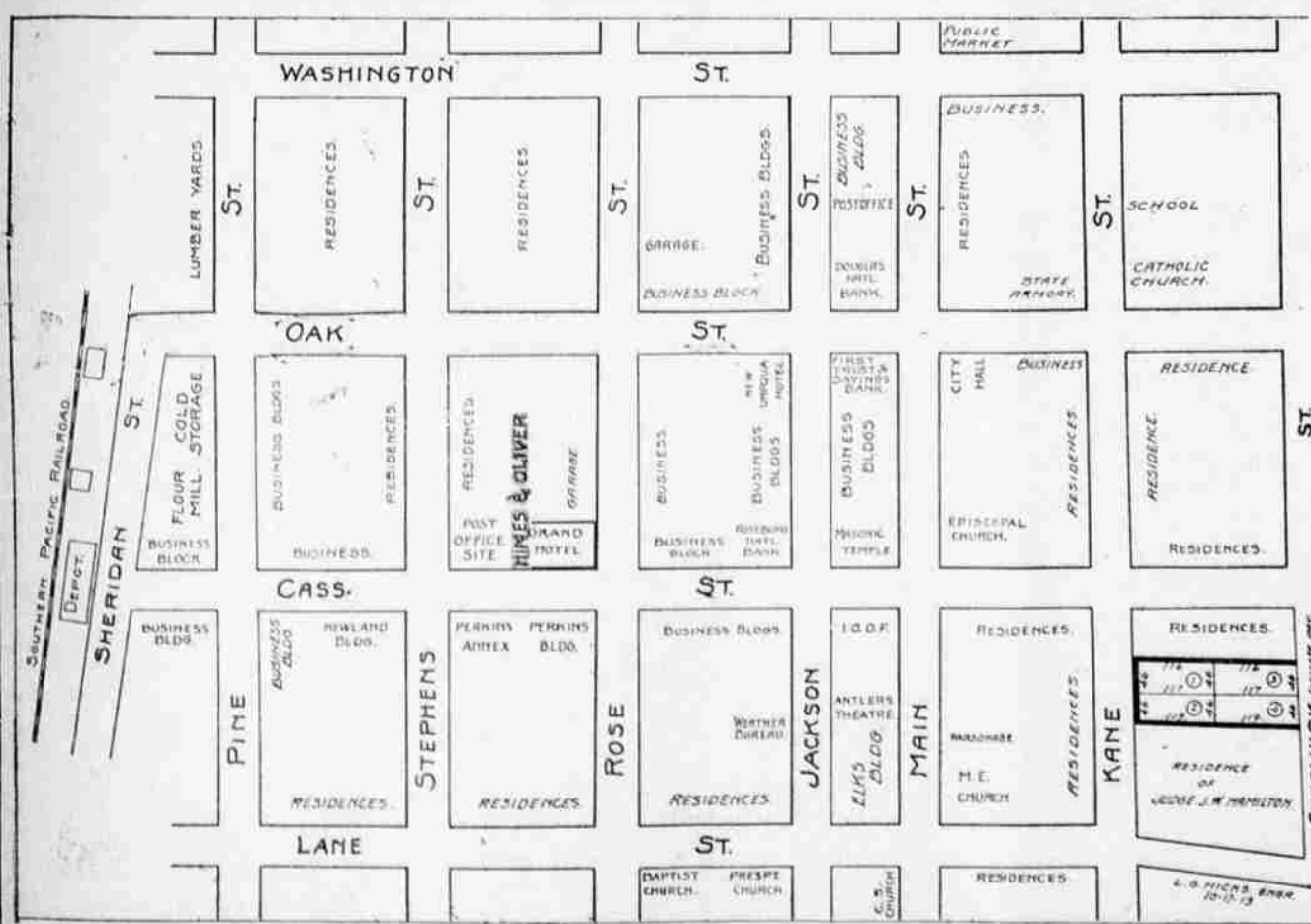
