ROME, Nov. 26, Precautions being taken today against any possible
attempt on the life of the King when
he goes to deliver the opening address of the twenty-fourth parliausent tomorrow.

The occasion has always been a
favorite one for anarchists in Italy to
attempt the King's life. In addition
the recent elections, which were the
first held in Italy under the universal suffrage, aroused a degree of excitement and agitation that has not
yet entirely almated.

The King will leave the Quirinal
in a closed carriage, entirely surrounded by mounted guards and will
proceed at a gallop to parfiament.
Troops will there be massed not only
in the plazza in front, but around
the entire building. Through these
the King will pass to the chamber
where, in addition to the deputies,
senators and ministers there will be
no one who has not been passed upon
by the Department of Public Safety.
The King will begin his address the
moment he reaches the gleaker
stand and will leave immediately
afterwards.
