NEWS OF THE WORLD.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 26.—A small army of laborers today were at work early putting the White House back into shape for its regular routine, following the marriage yesterday of Mrs. Margaret Woodrow Wilson to Francis Bowes Sayre. It is believed that the huge floral decorations will be distributed among the local hospitals and children's institutions.

ROME, Nov. 26.—Precautions being taken today against any possible attempt on the life of the King when he goes to deliver the opening address of the twenty-fourth parliament tomorrow.

The occasion has always been a favorite one for anarchists in Italy to attempt the King's life. In addition the recent elections, which were the first held in Italy under the universal suffrage, aroused a degree of excitement and agitation that has not yet entirely abated.

The King will leave the Quirinal in a closed carriage, entirely surrounded by mounted guards and will proceed at a gallop to parliament. Troops will there be massed not only in the piazza in front, but around the entire building. Through these the King will pass to the chamber where, in addition to the deputies, senators and ministers there will be no one who has not been passed upon by the Department of Public Safety. The King will begin his address the moment he reaches the speakers' stand and will leave immediately afterwards.

LA PAZ, Bolivia, South America, Nov. 26.—The American commercial invaders arrived here today to spend five days visiting commercial establishments and industries of the Bolivian city. They leave here Wednesday, December 3, for Antofagosta, Chile.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 26.—Hundreds of garments were today distributed to the poor of the National capital by the Needlework Guild, of which Mrs. Wilson, wife of the president, is the head. Mrs. Wilson was unable to aid in the distribution of the garments owing to fatigue after the White House wedding yesterday. She will take charge of the work some time later this week. The gifts are the usual Christmas presents which the Guild distribute every year to the poor of Washington.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 26.—The Argentine legation today received word that the special mission headed by Senor Villaneuva left Valparaiso today en route to this city to thank officials for participation in the centennial celebration of Argentine freedom from the Spanish yoke.
