MYRTLE CREEK NEWS.

Interesting Items Clipped From
Myrtle Creek Mail.

C. O. White began excavation work today preparatory to laying the foundation for a new concrete building on the lot adjoining the Mail office.

The recent school census of the Myrtle Creek district (No. 19) taken by C. M. Griffith, shows 207 pupils of school age. This is a gain of one over last year.

W. C. Dement took his daughter, Miss Zena, to Roseburg the first of the week and placed her under the care of doctors for treatment for appendicitis.

The E. L. French packing house which closed recently made a run of about twelve weeks, and during that time packed and shipped sixty-five cars of dried prunes, to various parts of the United States. It took a force of about forty men, women and girls to handle this output of prunes, and several thousand dollars was distributed in this vicinity for wages, in addition to an outlay of more than \$100,000 for the dried fruit.

Jackson Wright, who with his wife has been visiting relatives here for several days from the Grande Ronde Valley, Eastern Oregon, was one of the early pioneers of South Douglas county. In company with his father, Lazarus Wright, who subsequently took a donation land claim where the town of Myrtle Creek now stands, he arrived at Myrtle Creek in October, 1851, having crossed the plains the year previous. Other settlers at that time were Henry Adams, now deceased and J. W. Weaver now living in Missouri Bottom.

FOREST NOTES.

Twenty states have published reports of their wood-using industries.

A good grade of excelsior is being made from fire-killed Alpine fir and Engelmann spruce in Colorado.

It is predicted that western yellow pine will furnish an excellent source of turpentine as the southern pine becomes exhausted.

While there are five hemlocks in the United States, only two are of any commercial importance, common hemlock and western hemlock. Of these two, western hemlock makes the better lumber.

The Philippine bureau of forestry uses a launch for service between islands. The U. S. forest service employs several, both on inland lakes and in salt water, in Alaska and Florida.

Trunk manufacturers in Colorado are abandoning the usual basswood and cottonwood for the trunk box, and are turning to Engelmann spruce, which combines lightness, strength and ease of working.

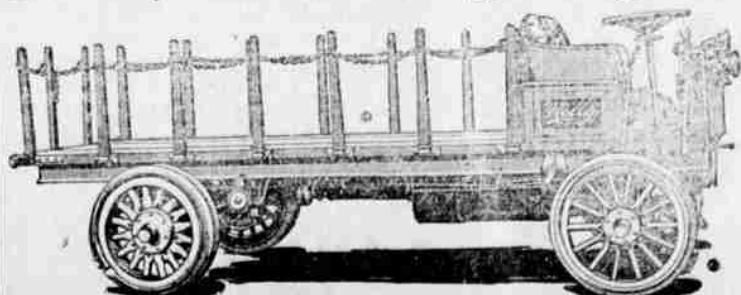
