The proposed route is 26 miles in length, or one mile in excess of the minimum required by the postoffice department. It is proposed for the route to start at Roseburg, pass through Edenbower and to Garden Valley and thence down the Umpqua river to Cleveland. The return trip would be made via Melrose and West Roseburg. The proposed route would serve about 100 families, many of whom are at present getting their mail at regularly established postoffices. While the local postoffice officials say nothing with regard to the effect of the new route, it is surmised that the star route now operating at Melrose, Cleveland and other points included in the proposed schedule would be abandoned. The petition will probably be sent to the postoffice department within the next few days.
