## NOTICE TO BRIDGE CONTRACTORS.

**Quines' Creek Bridge.**  
Bridge will span Cow Creek in section 22, T. 32 S., R. 5 W., W. M. and will consist of one (100 ft.) one hundred foot wooden span of the Smith parallel cord truss design; one hundred eighty two ft. (182 ft.) of pile bent trestle approaches; and two piers of type "A" or "B" as shown on the plans. The above bridge will have a clear roadway of 16 feet and a clear headroom of 15 feet.

Bidders must build the bridge as shown on the plans, that are on file in the County Clerk's office.

Bids for the trestle approaches to be by the bid, foot.

Bidders will submit bids for each type of pier complete.

Bidders must visit site and satisfy themselves as to the local conditions. The County Clerk reserves no responsibility on account of lack of knowledge on the part of the bidder.

All bids must be accompanied by a certified check in an amount equal to five per cent of the bid. Envelopes in which bids are placed must be endorsed with the name of the bidder for which the bid is made.
