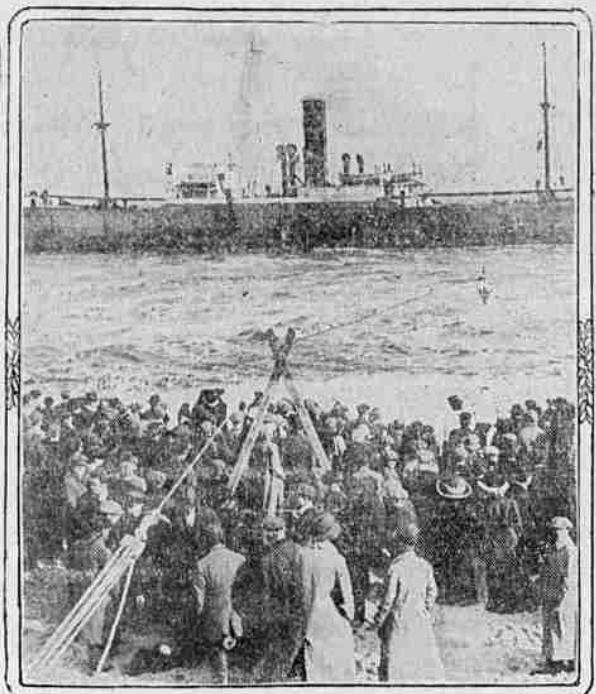

REMARKABLE PHOTOGRAPH OF RESCUE BY BREECHES BUOY



Just at the time when we were congratulating ourselves that modern ship-building, wireless, and other means of safe-guarding life from sea disasters, the Monroe was rammed and sank within thirty minutes, thus defeating all precautionary methods. Now, however, the breeches buoy has come back into prominence as a life saver. The unusual picture was made as a cabin boy of the British Steel Freighter Queen Louise was being whisked to shore and safety when his ship ran afoul of a shoal a half mile north of Manasquan, N. J. Because of the heavy sea running it was impossible to get a life boat to the big freighter, so the U. S. Life Saving Corps resorted to the life line and breeches buoys, which was operated without any trouble. The ship was carrying a cargo of block tin from Cardiff, Wales, to the Standard Oil Company, New York.
