

SHASTA COUNTY ARRANGES FOR HIGHWAY BONDS

The actual deal was consummated yesterday by which the county took over \$200,000 of highway bonds. Or rather it did not take them at all, only in a figurative sense. The Redding National Bank has the paper and will dispose of it through bond brokers, for which they pay \$192,000 and Shasta county is out \$8,000 on the transaction, says the Searchlight.

The county was lucky in the purchase at this time, as the first allotment of \$5,000,000 has all been sold, except \$300,000 so great is the demand from the different counties that are eager to start work. The next allotment will be put on the market fifteen months from now.

It is deemed a stroke of good policy by the business men of Redding and the county to put the highway through before 1915. The \$8,000 that is lost to the county in the transaction is equal to an investment. It will assure a vast amount of work for the unemployed and be the means of turning a tide of money towards mercantile interests of the county.—Red Bluff (Cal.) News.

THE SWINE HERD— GRADE SOWS WILL DO

The Right and the Wrong Way of Engaging In The Hog Industry.

Professor Thomas Shaw: There is a right and a wrong way of going into pork raising. Persons who are not familiar with the business are pretty certain to take the wrong way. At least they are quite apt to take the wrong methods as the method that is judicious and right.

What is meant by the wrong method? It means, first, that farmers are generally of the opinion that they must purchase high-bred sows or sows that are purely bred, and it means, second, that foundation stocks may be brought in that will bring hog cholera with them. The lack of information on these two points is going to cost the ranchmen dearly in all the Northwestern states.

When choosing foundation sows it is not essential that they shall be purely bred or even highly graded, unless the ranchman is going to produce pure-bred swine for breeding. It does not matter how mixed the breeding. But it does matter that the sows shall have good conformation. Good conformation means a long body and enough of length of limb to make the sows active as grazers during the season of grazing. It does not matter much what the blood components are, providing the conformation is as stated above. Mixed blood elements are advantageous, rather than prejudicial, for the reason that the more mixed the blood elements on the side of the dam, the more rapid will be the improvement when such dams are mated with pure bred sires of any breed. This is a lesson that it is to be feared not many ranchmen have learned and it is a lesson which they are slow to learn. The idea is almost universal that the breeder must begin with high grade sows. As a rule he will succeed later with low grade sows, because of the less cost. But he must give attention to the selection of long bodied sows. This will insure the production of relatively large litters and of only.

Farmers' Institute Closes For Season MADISON, Wis., March 13.—The last of a highly successful season of "Farmers' Institutes," conducted under the auspices of the extension department of the University of Wisconsin, were held today at Wile Rose, Appleton, Oshkosh, De Pere and New Lisbon. Officials in charge of the "institutes" reported on the work that has been done. Their reports contained high testimonials from farmers all over the state who declare they have received vast benefits from the system. Wisconsin was the pioneer in this movement to hold meetings in small towns where farmers gathered for instruction in practical and scientific methods of building up their farms and increasing their profits not only through development of larger crops but also through establishment of a better system of reaching the consumers with their products.
