CONVICT LABOR ON ROADS.

Plan of Working Prisoners Is Proving

Successful in Several States.
The plan of working convict inter on the roads, which was given a trial on small scale in Illinois last fall, provid so successful that more trusted in mates of the state penitentiary will be used on the roads this spring and sum-mer. There are 250 prisoners in the Jolet prison who are to be used on the reads. Arrangements have been made whereby the counties wanting help will pay 50 cents each for the use of the men, but none will be sent to work on less than five miles of road. It is always to the read of the county to the planned to divide the men into five squads of fifty each, so that five com-munities may be served at once. The state agrees to furnish the rock for macadam roads provided the counties pay the freight on it from Jeliet to the

marrest railway point.

Texus has decided to try the use of convict labor on the public roads with out guards or shackles. Governor Col-quitt has made a contract whereby fifty convicts were sent to Smith coun nity convicts were sent to Smith county, in northwest Texas, to work the roads radiating from Lindale in what is known as road district No. 1, which recently issued \$75,000 of bonds.

Liberal appropriations to permit the

employment of convicts on the high ways of New York state are recom-mended by the state commission of risons in its annual report to the leg slature. More than 400 convicts were so employed at various times during the past summer and fall by order of the superintendent of state prisons with gratifying results, both from the viewpoint of the state and the convict-

themselves, the commission states.
Following the resolutions adopted by the state automobile association at Portland, plans are being mapped out whereby Maine will adopt the con-vict system of road labor now used in a number of other states. It is felt a number of other states. It is felt that this would save the state much money, give the prisoners outdoor in bor and increase the speed of road

The various good roads asso-lations, commercial clubs, chambers of commerce and automobile clubs will be called upon to take the initiative While it is realized that it will be impossible to get all the city folk out into the country, it is hered that they will observe the occasion of cleanup day in their neighborhood.


