**SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT'S  
ANNUAL REPORT IS FILED**

The annual school report has just been compiled by the county school superintendent and forwarded to the state office at Salem. The report contains a complete summary of the work in Douglas county and gives many interesting facts in regard to the schools. According to the report there are enrolled in the Douglas county schools 1757 pupils between the ages of 4 and 21. There are employed in the county 230 teachers, receiving as a total amount of salaries \$95,981.14. The number of eighth grade diplomas issued this year was 289. The high schools of the county have an enrollment of 549 pupils. The total amount of money taken in during the year was \$181,549.50, the disbursements \$161,325.51, leaving a balance on hand of \$20,223.99. The total indebtedness of the schools of the county is \$156,116.61. The value of the school houses and grounds amounts to \$323,873.00. The average district tax is 3 mills.

**WEEKLY CROP REPORT.**

Following is a summary of the crop conditions in Oregon for the week ending August 17, 1914, as reported to the office of the weather bureau by special correspondents throughout the state:

Ideal harvesting weather prevailed last week. Temperatures averaged slightly above normal and no rain of consequence fell in the agricultural sections of the state. The fall wheat harvest is nearing completion and the spring wheat harvest is well advanced. In nearly all counties the yields are turning out better than expected, except on what are called "dry land" farms. Some grain on those farms was not worth harvesting and in nearly all cases the yields were below the average. Corn, which heretofore has been backward on account of cool weather, made splendid advancement during the last two or three weeks and now promises to mature as early as usual. No reports

were received regarding hops, but the weather has been favorable for them. Pasturage is getting brown in the southern counties, but no complaints are made of a shortage in feed. Light smoke is beginning to be noticeable in the atmosphere from forest or brush fires.

Early apples, plums and peaches are plentiful in the market. Crawford peaches from the Ashland district are now ripe. Pears and late apples are making satisfactory growth.

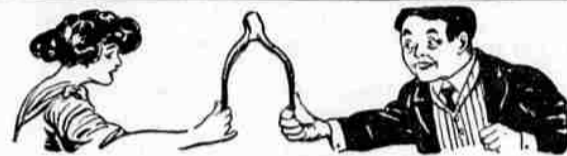

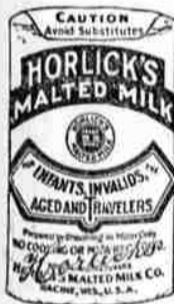
