### ARMY OFFICERS TOAST KAISER

PORTLAND, Aug. 21.—Such an act, if committed, is a direct violation of the regulations of the United States army. This was the declaration of Senator Chamberlain, following the receipt of a communication from George Shepherd, a Portland attorney, charged that two United States army officers, in uniform, whose names he had been told were Captain Waldron and Lieutenant Gardner, stationed at Fort Stevens, drank to the toasts "Deutschland Ueber Alles" (Germany over all), and "Germany Forever," with former subjects of the Kaiser in a grill at Astoria last evening. The senator stated that the letter of Shepherd was forwarded to the secretary of war.

**Toast to Kaiser Opposed.**  
American army officers should not join in "Deutschland Ueber Alles" and "Hoch Der Kaiser," or other such toasts in a public cafe or discuss openly in German the success of the Kaiser's army with German subjects, opines George S. Shepherd, a Portland attorney, who witnessed such a scene at Astoria.  
Mr. Shepherd, after obtaining the names of witnesses present, wrote a letter to Senator Chamberlain, chairman of the senate committee on military affairs, who was a member of the delegation from Portland.

**FIELD DAY FOR ORCHARDISTS**  
Prof. W. S. Brown, of the Oregon Agricultural College, spent the whole of the day Friday in pruning lectures and demonstrations in the vicinity of Roseburg. The program for the day had been worked out with a good deal of care, and the result was the most valuable day these orchardists have had in many years. In the morning the demonstrations were given in the Winston region, at the Booth-Fisher orchards and the Bradburn and Skinner orchards. Summer pruning of both young and old trees was taken up, and a large number of growers took the work. In the afternoon the demonstrations were made

in Garden Valley where over fifty growers, including a number of ladies, followed the work. The lead was tremendous, but it did not dampen the enthusiasm of the growers who realized that they were getting exactly what they needed. There is no better expert in the Northwest than Professor W. S. Brown, and the people who have had his advice on this and other visits, are very grateful to the O. A. C. for permitting him to come here at the expense of the extension department of the college. The pruning location in Garden Valley was at the Hinkley orchard. Orchards belonging to Messrs Harding, McDonald and others were also visited.

### MILITIAMEN PREPARING FOR RIFLE AND PISTOL COMPETITION

The adjutant general's office has announced that the annual rifle and pistol competition will be held at the Clackamas rifle range on September 9, 10 and 11 with preliminary practice on the 7th and 8th. The pay of those competing will commence on September 9, providing that personal registration is made with the camp adjutant upon arrival at camp.

Only one officer and four enlisted men are eligible for a team and the captain is the highest ranking officer eligible. Each individual member must have performed at least seventy five per cent of the military duty during the time he has been a member and he must have been a member for at least a year prior to the shoot.

It is from among the participants of this shoot that the teams are picked that will participate in the national shoot which will be held at the Florida state camp grounds near Jacksonville during the month of October.

The company from Roseburg has always had an enviable record when it comes to shooting and it is expected that some of the crack shots will make their presence felt at the Clackamas range and from there will go to participate in the national contest.
