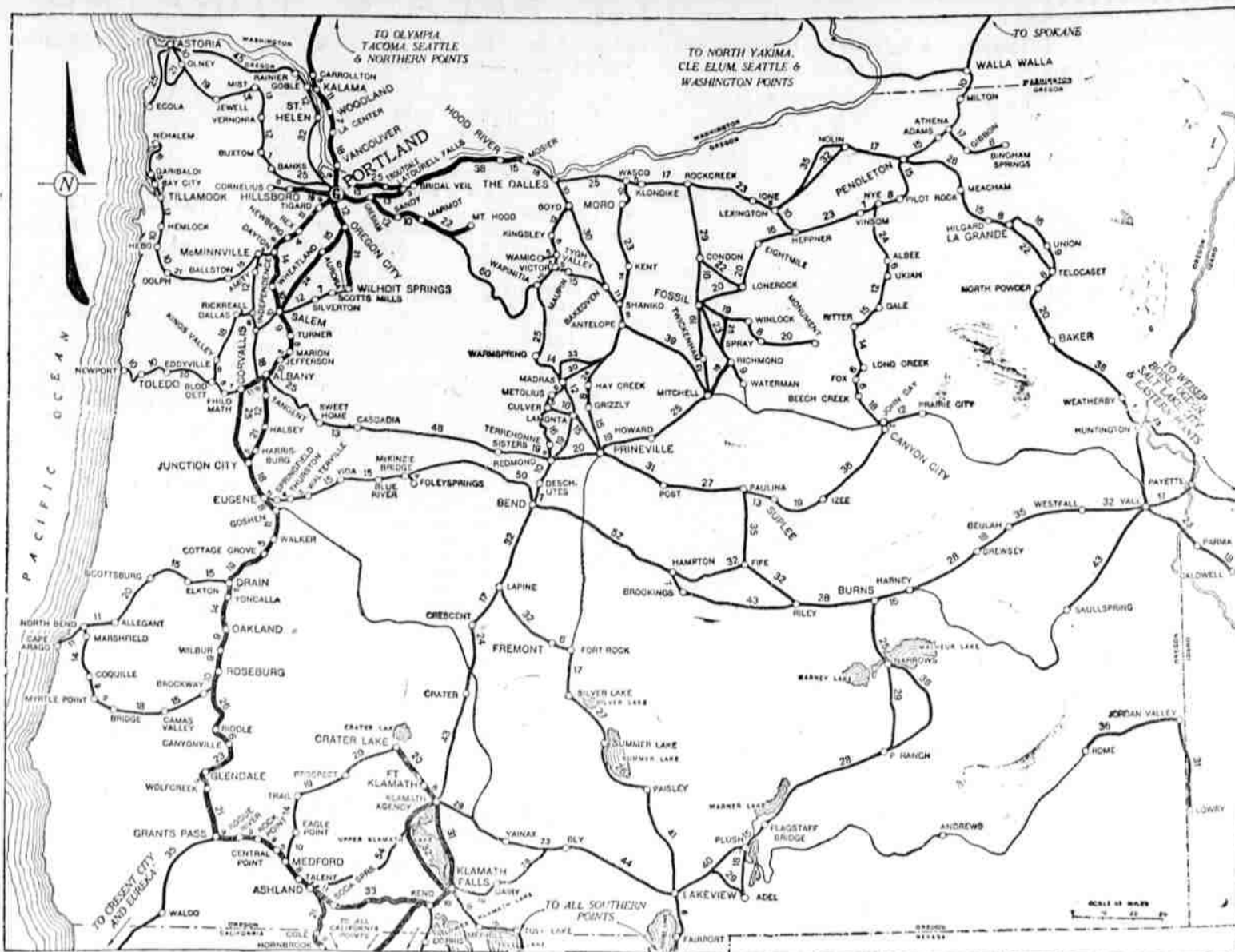


GOODRICH TOURING MAP OF OREGON



The Goodrich National Touring Bureau has just issued for motor travel a complete diagram highway map of Oregon showing all of the recommended lines of automobile travel, with mileages indicated between the towns. ANNUAL CONFERENCE M. E. CHURCH SOUTH

The fiftieth annual session of the Columbia conference of the Methodist Episcopal church South will convene in Roseburg Thursday morning, September 9, 1915, with Bishop Walter R. Lambuth, of Nashville, Tenn., presiding. The annual session of the Woman's Missionary Societies will be held at the same time with Mrs. D. M. John, of Corvallis, presiding. These sessions will bring to Roseburg many preachers, lay delegates, and women delegates. The opening sermon will be Wednesday night, September 8, at 8 o'clock, sermon by Rev. H. M. Law.

There will be present at this conference session some of the great preachers of America. Bishop Lambuth is a really great man. He is one of the most popular of the bishops. He has had extensive experience in Africa and other foreign lands where he has been engaged in missionary work. He is also a really great preacher. Dr. E. B. Chappell, of Nashville, Tenn., will be here and conduct several afternoon Sunday school institutes. He is the general secretary of the Sunday school board of the M. E. church South. He is an authority on Sunday school work. He will be worth hearing. D. B. Price, of the church extension board, and Dr. W. W. Pinson of the board

of missions will be present. Rev. H. S. Shangle, financial agent of Columbia college, of Milton, Ore., and Rev. E. R. Naylor, president of the college will attend the sessions. Dr. W. E. Vaughan, editor of the Pacific Methodist Advocate, of San Francisco, who is well known in Roseburg, will be one of the strong men of the conference.
Sunday, September 12, will perhaps be a great day in Roseburg. Conventional officers of the church and pastors of the conference will fill the pulpits of the various churches on this date, and the people will have an opportunity to hear these men in their own churches. Definite announcements will be made from time to time during the sessions of the conference concerning the items of interest.
Rev. E. H. Mowre, the presiding elder of the Willamette district, who has been presiding elder for four years will be removed from the district this month because of the time limit. It is believed that Mr. Mowre will transfer to one of the California conferences. He is well liked in Oregon and it is with regret that people learn of his contemplated transfer. The preachers will be stationed for the next year at the close of the conference on Sunday night, Sept. 12. The conference is open in all its sessions to the people of Roseburg, and good will be derived by attending.
