### CONGREGATION WILL STAND BEHIND ITS PASTOR, DR. HILLS

Noted Brooklyn Pulpit Orator Explains Financial Difficulties To His Church.

NEW YORK, Sept. 21.—The Plymouth church congregation will stand by Rev. Newell Dwight Hillis, their pastor and noted lecturer, in his efforts to straighten out his confessedly tangled financial affairs. Following his dramatic statement made from his pulpit, when he declared that ambition had led him from his ideals, Hillis offered to sell his \$20,000 home to meet his obligations it was reported today.

Hillis will continue to preach, with the support of a majority of his members.

Few more dramatic incidents than his pulpit statement have been known in Brooklyn.

With his voice shaken by emotion, while his congregation listened in awe, he told them that ambition had brought him to the verge of poverty, and that he was not now worthy to loose the shoe laces of a poor slum worker.

For some weeks, rumors of financial difficulties have been current, and last week, the storm seemed to come to a head when Percy Hillis, a nephew, instituted a \$50,000 suit, charging that the pastor had libeled him in Portland, in declaring that he was lecturing to pay the nephew's debts.

Friends of the Hillises are attempting to settle the nephew's suit out of court.

Dr. Hillis will be remembered by the citizens of Roseburg from his connection with the Chautauqua this last summer, he having delivered a lecture on the "America of Tomorrow". Upon his arrival in Portland he was served with papers in a suit to recover some \$12,000 on notes signed by him, which he stated were given to pay debts incurred by his nephews. At the time he was given great credit for his self-sacrifice and lauded on all sides. Since then it has developed the money was owed by himself to cover speculations in timber, and one of the nephews demanded a retraction of his statement, and not receiving it, he instituted a suit for defamation of character, asking damages in the sum of \$50,000. This suit was the cause of the dramatic scene in the famous church in Brooklyn last week.
