

The fame of the Scotia, which burned in Bristol Channel this month and was beached at Sully, lay in the fact that she carried the Scotish national antarctic expedition to the South Polar regions under the comman of Dr. William S. Bruce, where she carried out some valuable work in co-operation with the English expedi-tion under Captain Scott, and German and Swedish expeditions. Following the ill-fated voyage of the Titanic the Scotia was used to carry out ice observations, meteorology and oceanography in the North Atlantic ocean.


